What: Barrio Logan College Institute's mission is to promote the pursuit of higher education for students who are traditionally under-represented in college through after-school programs that begin in third grade. The Institute serves 125 students and their families annually with parent involvement classes, academic support and tutoring, skill building lessons and activities, exposure to different career paths, and SAT Prep. In addition, the students receive individual college counseling and support as they transition into the first in their families to go to college.
