music by the Commander Navy Region Southwest Band. Dozens of members of the Navy were guests at the meeting, along with the Band. President **Bonnie Schwartz** called the meeting to order and **John Ohanian** provided an inspirational moment about Eagles teaching their young to fly and applying that attitude to our lives. **Steve Hubbard** then led us in the Pledge of Allegiance. The great music then continued with the Navy's own Ashley Monroig singing the Star Spangled Banner accompanied by the Navy's wonderful band. Singing our Nation's National Anthem to the music of a Navy Band with sailors at every table dressed in their crisp Navy Whites – it doesn't get more inspiring than that!

Bert Wahlen, dapper as usual, provided the news. In 1915, Club 33 actually had a stunt committee that pulled practical jokes at meetings. President Bonnie may be considering reinstating this committee but most potential members are already on the annual Roast committee. Following the news, Bonnie retook the helm without incident or even a shake of her 9 iron. Bonnie welcomed DG Dave Breeding and wife Marilee, thanked **John Morrell** for hosting a well attended Poolside Chat at his lovely home and we all sang happy 90th birthday to **Jim Haugh**. Bill Gates Sr. will be the featured speaker at the Large Club Conference joint luncheon February 10, 2011.

Tuesday, Bonnie led a group of Rotarians who visited Naturalization Ceremonies at Golden Hall. Bonnie's talk to almost 1,000 new citizens was undoubtedly inspiring. **Bob Witty** announced the end of summer tennis tournament next week (tennis is 900 years old, older than golf) and **Paul Nestor** introduced Commander Ed Anderson, commander of the USS Jefferson City. Commander Anderson is graciously making his sub available to 60 lucky Rotarians on September 7, 2010, a must attend event.

The helm was turned over to Rotary Past President and Consul to Chile **George Gildred**, who introduced and welcomed Juan Pablo Zuniga, the CO of a visiting Chilean

Submarine, and also Vice Admiral Richard Hunt.

Bonnie then delegated the helm once again, this time to Chair of the Day, Rear Admiral **William French**. After welcoming visiting Rotarians (the furthest traveling from the Bahamas), Bill gave us interesting information about our Navy. Seventy percent of the globe is water, 80 percent of its inhabitants live near the coast and 90 percent of trade occurs over water. Protecting all of that is a tall order willingly accepted by the Navy. The DOD calculates that the Navy's total economic impact to San Diego County is \$26.5 billion, and the Navy provides 328,080, or 23% of San Diego jobs. Our County receives about \$16.1 billion in direct defense spending.

Admiral French then introduced our speaker of the day, Admiral Gary Roughead. Admiral Roughead, United States Navy, is the 29th Chief of Naval Operations. A 1973 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy, Admiral Roughead's accomplishments, awards and commendations are incredibly impressive and too numerous to list. The Navy, like civilian businesses, is facing the challenges of our times, budgets including "making payroll" in a challenging economic environment and "going green" in a changing global climate. Like Club 33, the Navy is about to celebrate its 100th anniversary in San Diego.

What started in 1901 as a Navy Coaling Station has morphed into a multi-billion dollar operation greatly impacting and benefiting our City and County. Many new Navy ships and aircraft are already in or are coming to San Diego. Sailors and ships from San Diego affect the entire globe performing multiple international roles. Admiral Roughead told us 14,000 sailors are on the ground in Iraq and Afghanistan and another 10,000 are offshore in the area. Over 330,000 men and women proudly serve their Country in the Navy, and Admiral Roughead is constantly impressed with the quality of these fine young persons.

On a lighter note, Admiral Roughead did express a personal concern. He told his wife he had a very busy trip in San Diego, with little if any downtime. He arrived here only to learn he had an outdoor presentation to make, and is trying to figure out how to explain the resulting tan or sunburn he expects to get.
